

Evergreen Missionary Baptist Church established in DeQuincy in 1911

Evergreen Missionary Baptist Church was the first Black church organized in DeQuincy in 1911 by Rev. Ambrose. Families who helped organize the early church were Dave Miller, Sr., the Stoudmires, and the Quillers.

The church was rebuilt in 1913 after being destroyed by a storm and again in 1958 after a fire.

Ministers who have served as pastors were Rev. Matthew Simmons (1914-1919), Rev. Groves (1919-1948) and Rev. Allen Gillespie (1948-1982). Rev. Willie Stevens was called to pastor the church in March, 1983. Evergreen is presently under the leadership of Pastor James B. Harris. Pastor Harris was called to the church in October, 1998.

Evergreen is presently a member of the New Light Association and the National Baptist Convention of America, Inc.

The church has served as an outreach center, a collection point for food, clothing and other goods to be distributed to needy families of the community.

This church was also the first school for Blacks as well as a meeting place for civic leaders and members of the community. The local chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) continue to meet monthly at the church.

The mission of Evergreen Missionary Baptist Church has been to meet the needs of the community through worship, fellowship and discipleship. We invite you to join us as we lift up the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

DISCIPLESHIP

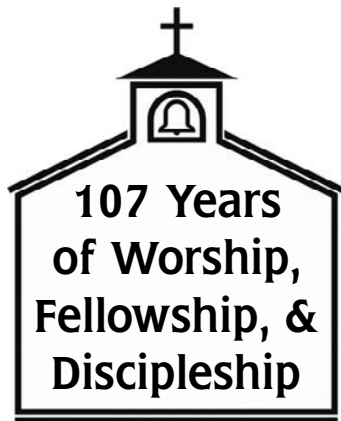
Let us become students of the Master Teacher Christ Jesus

In August of 2010, seeking God's will, my family and I came to visit The Pentecostal Church of DeQuincy. God assured me beyond any doubt that He had placed us in DeQuincy to serve Him, this church and our region.

Over the last 7 years we have taken our Sunday School Department and church through an entire renovation. We have tripled our attendance in Sunday School while maxing out the use of our entire building facilities.

To accommodate our expected growth, we are moving forward with a capital stewardship campaign to fund our building project.

Our capital campaign,

"BUILD," will enable us to construct a new Christian Education Building and Event Center to house expanded ministry space for children through adults as well as a multi-purposed Event Center accelerating our ability to reach 800 attendees.

Our Event Center, with a commercial kitchen, will enable us to seat 400 to meet the dining needs of all ministries, social events, weddings, etc. Additionally, a refurbished gym and family recreational space will be included along with a Pastoral and Administrative Of-

fice Complex. Our BUILD campaign will provide a vision for our future and ensure growth for generations.
